Showing that Samuel Dennis Tabor, late of Marsh. Cnty, State of Ind. died on or about the 22nd. day of Ap. 1864 in said Cnty and that said decedent left a personal estate in said cnty. to be administered upon of the probable value of \$2000.00 as he is informed and believes.

Thereupon said Cyrus Tabor files with the clerk of said court his bond made payable to the State of Ind. in the personal sum of \$4000.00. in due form of law conditioned for the faithful performance of his duties as adm. with Geo. Deacon and Isreal G. Roberts as surety thereon to the approval and satisfaction of said clerk.

The condition of the above obligation is, that is, the above bound Cyrus Tabor, shall faithfully discharge the duties of his trust as Adm. of the Extate of Samuel D. Tabor (dec.) according to law then the above obligation is to be void else to remain in full force.
